



Kingsweston School Primary PE and Sport Premium 2017-18



Introduction

At Kingsweston, Physical Education (PE) and Sport play an integral role in making our vision statement a reality for pupils, of all abilities, to achieve their potential and to promote lifelong participation.

PE and Sport provide our pupils with opportunities to develop the important qualities of self-control, determination, communication, team work and commitment. This should lead to improved engagement, concentration, attitude and achievement in all aspects of their development.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding until 2020 to improve provision of PE and Sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this funding to enhance our provision of high quality PE and to add to our existing resources.

What does this mean for our school?

The conditions of grant document for the PE and sport premium says that the purpose of the premium is to "...fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils..." It adds that the premium is also intended to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

Schools are free to decide how to spend the grant, but must be able to show that their spending has led to a "direct and sustained" improvement in sporting provision.

The guidance from the DfE and EFA, linked to above, says that schools should use the funding to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities they already offer
- Make improvements that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Within the context of special schools spending PE and sports premium money on sensory equipment could be appropriate if this enables children with complex needs to participate in physical activity.

We must consider what will help the pupils get the best out of physical education, and spend the grant accordingly.

We received £8,225 to spend on improving and maintaining high quality P.E. and Sport in school in 2016-17.

Summative Evaluation for 2016/17

Priorities at the beginning of the year:

1. Support for swimming and hydrotherapy:

- ⇒ The provision of staff to provide both safe transport and in water support.
- ⇒ Support in changing and transitioning to and from the pool and in and out of the water.

2. Provision of outdoor and adventurous activities.

3. Provision of external expertise and new equipment to extend the range of learning opportunities to pupils and CPD to staff.

4. Sensory Integration advice provided to support engagement and learning in PE.

Swimming



Pupils had fantastic fun building on previously learnt personally targeted skills this year. These included some great progress in independent dressing and more confident transitions in and out of the water. Some pupils developed their floating skills. 2 pupils have been able to participate in the sessions for the first time this year, having gained confidence to enter and spend time in the water. Levels of engagement in physical activity has increased for all participating pupils. A range of basic water skills were developed and a number of pupils swam 25m (individually targeted). A very high percentage of targets were achieved.

Most importantly the sessions have been used to support sensory needs. The water provides a blanket of deep pressure which enables the pupils to develop a better sense of where the body is in space and therefore improves control and placement over time. Moreover buoyancy can assist, support or resist, depending on the activity undertaken. Some of the areas that are supported and improved by such sessions are motor planning, self-regulation, strength and coordination.

Increased participation in PE Lessons...



Following last year's work with the Bristol Spectrum Project, the team were able to plan and deliver a bank of activities to develop independent participation in whole group activities across the primary phase. By the end of the year some pupils were able to complete increasing periods of group activity without support for the first time. Moreover it enabled important cross-curricula links to support speaking and listening outcomes as well as social interaction progress for all pupils, as evidenced in the number of pupils who achieved or exceeded year end expectations.

Amongst the benefits of the specialist PE Coach was that pupil specific assessments and subsequent interventions were undertaken which enhanced access and engagement in ways which went beyond the PE curriculum. Pupils also developed skills relating to community access. Pupils engaged with the Sports Coach and experienced a wide range of sports and expectations. Pupils practiced transitioning and demonstrated skills in PE that they had acquired in the events provided.

Yoga



Some pupils participated in Yoga sessions at the beginning of every afternoon. The purchase of special yoga mats, supported pupils understanding of the expectations for this special, sensorial calming activity. The sessions proved highly effective in enabling pupils to re-focus for learning after playtime, as well supporting the development of body awareness, placement and control. All participating pupils made very pleasing progress, and 4 pupils exceeded their targets and mastered 2 or more poses independently.
