



Kingsweston School Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up Premium Grant 2017-18



Introduction

The Government has made a commitment to provide additional funding to schools for each Year 7 pupil who did not achieve at least level 4 in the Key Stage 2 national curriculum tests in reading and/or mathematics. The purpose of this funding is to enable schools to deliver additional support for those pupils that most need it.

Action plan and evaluation for Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up Premium 2016-17

Priority: *To secure high quality pupil transitions supporting early engagement and achievement in Y7 for pupils who find such transitions challenging.*

Reading - 12 pupils in year 7: all 12 met or exceeded their reading targets, 9 UQ Targets and 3 Teacher set targets Maths - Of the 12 Y7 pupils 87% of the challenging maths targets were met or exceeded within a context of 82% being set within the Upper Quartile of Progression Guidance where appropriate.
Backfill for existing staff to support transition placements on an increasing rate and duration.	£3,000	
Duplication of individually identified key English and Maths resources to support transition.	£500	
Sensory Integration support and advice.	£750	

Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up Premium 2017-18

The Education and Skills Funding Agency have announced that they will allocate funding to schools on the basis that they receive the same overall amount of year 7 catch-up premium funding they received in 2016 to 2017 although it will be adjusted to reflect the percentage change in the size the year 7 cohort, based on the October 2017 census.

The school has assessed the needs of the pupils and ensured that the funding is targeted appropriately to support individual progress of each of these pupils.

Priority for Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up Premium 2017-18

Priority: *To secure high quality pupil transitions supporting early engagement and achievement in Y7 for pupils who find such transitions challenging.*

Given the positive impact of transition support in the last academic year it has been determined that we will use the available funding (albeit a reduced amount) to support equivalent transitions in the forthcoming academic year.

(Note Sensory Integration support and advice being funded from alternative sources).
